Almshouses for the over 50s in London

Definitions of Almshouses

- a home for the poor that is maintained by private charity;
- a privately supported house offering accommodation to the aged or needy.

History of Almshouses

Almshouses are charitable housing provided to enable people (typically elderly people who can no longer work to earn enough to pay rent) to live in a particular community. They are often targeted at the poor of a locality, at those from certain forms of previous employment, or their widows, and are generally maintained by a charity or the trustees.

Almshouses — so named — are European Christian institutions. Alms are, in the Christian tradition, monies or services donated to support the poor and indigent. Almshouses were established from the 10th century in Britain, to provide a place of residence for poor, old and distressed folk. The first recorded Almshouse was founded in York by King Athelstan. In the middle ages the majority of European hospitals functioned as almshouses.

Almshouses have been created throughout the period since the 10th century, up to the present day. There is no strict delineation between Almshouses and other forms of sheltered housing, although Almshouses will tend to be characterised by their charitable status and by the aim of supporting the continued independence of their residents.

Current Procedure for Applications

Generally the criteria to qualify for Almshouses are for clients who are over 55 years of age, on a low income and classed as “needy”. Applications are made either directly to the almshouse or via the Stonewall Housing Officer, depending on the applicant’s preference. Please be advised that this process can take anything from between 4 to 12 weeks and some areas operate a waiting list system.

Day's Almshouses has eight homes in Edgware. Preference is given to applicants living in Edgware and Little Stanmore. Operates a waiting list.

Eleanor Palmer Trust assists elderly people in 75 homes in High Barnet. Will only assist residents of High Barnet and East Barnet. Operates a waiting list. Accepts referrals.

Finchley Charities manages 163 sheltered homes for the elderly in East Finchley and Finchley Central. Applicants must have lived at least five years in the former borough of Finchley and have reached the age of 60. Operates a waiting list. Accepts referrals.

Lancelot Hasluck Trust owns 44 homes in East Barnet. Will only consider people over 55 who have lived in the districts of Barnet, East Barnet and Friern Barnet for the preceding six months or a significant period during the past twenty years. Applicants have to be on low income. Operates a waiting list.

Consolidated Almshouse Charity of Lawrence Campe assists the elderly. 20 homes in Friern Barnet; operates a waiting list. Referrals accepted.

Leo Baeck is an almshouse & owns some properties for elderly people in Golders Green.
